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

The model was built by David Peterson and was happily running through Austin on the MRS layout.




This year's raffle layout. The club member who built this did a magnificent job. It is a very detailed layout!

Hi folks,

I wanted to share the preliminary results of the Train Show:

We didn't just break our attendance record, we *shattered* it. It looks like the final paid attendance was 2,642, with an estimated additional 1,127 children, for a grant total of 3,769 attendees (not counting staff and exhibitors).

While I won't have final financial numbers for a week or so (I need to get the final bill from the Palmer Events Center), I can say we were definitely profitable. In addition, the raffle brought in over \$1,500 and our sales table brought in an incredible \$5,000+. (Before taxes and credit card/PayPal fees.)

I understand we also handed out hundreds of flyers about the AMRS, so perhaps we'll see a number of new faces at meetings soon as well.

Thank you ALL for doing such as great job to make the show a success. The income from the train show goes towards our mission of education, our permanent layout fund, and helps to enhance our existing layout.


